

Can I get NBN for my granny flat?

Whether or not you can get an independent NBN connection for your granny flat depends on its address and setup.

If Your Granny Flat Has Its Own Address:

If your granny flat has a unique, registered address separate from the primary residence, you can apply for an independent NBN connection by following the standard connection process.

If Your Granny Flat Shares the Address with the Primary Residence:

In this case, getting a separate NBN connection may require additional steps or considerations. Here are your options:

- Extend the Connection from the Primary Residence:

If the primary residence is already connected to the NBN (or plans to connect in the future), you can simply extend their existing connection to your granny flat. This might involve running an Ethernet cable or using a Wi-Fi extender to ensure stable internet access.

- Considerations for Connection:

The distance between the primary residence and the granny flat can impact the quality of an extended connection or Wi-Fi sharing. For a better signal, you might need additional equipment like mesh routers, Wi-Fi extenders, or Ethernet cabling.

If you're renting the granny flat, you should discuss the arrangement with the property owner, as they may need to approve changes or installations.

- Request a Second Connection:

- Wireless Broadband:
